Requirements for Entering:

- 1. Exhibitors must read and comply with all **Fair Rules and Regulations**, located on page 3, for participation in the Woodstock Fair.
- Exhibitors must read and comply with the Connecticut Fair and Show Requirements located on page 4 and the Memorandum located on page 5, set forth by the State of Connecticut Department of Agriculture which will be strictly observed.
- 3. Exhibitors are required to call or email the goat superintendents to reserve pen space for the number of animals registered. All class entries must be received by fair entry deadline or space will be forfeited. When the pens are full, the superintendents reserve the right to close entries.
- Registration and health papers will be verified by the goat superintendents upon arrival. Acceptance or rejection of goats will be at the discretion of the superintendents and/or health officials.
- 5. Indicate each breed of goat on entry form.
- Purebreds must have a registration certificate and ear tags, tattoos or EIDs that match.
- 8. Any goats not properly cleaned or fitted for show will be rejected at the discretion of the superintendents.
- 9. Entries are limited to 8 animals per farm/family unit.
- A goat may not be dual entered (ex. cannot be entered in Dairy and Market Classes).
- 11. Only one entry per exhibitor in group lots.
- 12. Pet Goats and Fiber Goats may be penned Thursday, Aug. 31 from 3pm -8pm and must be penned by Friday, Sept. 1 from 8:45 am. Release is Saturday, Sept. 2 at 6pm.
- 13. Dairy and Market Goats may be penned Saturday, Sept. 2 from 6pm-8pm and must be penned by Sunday, Sept. 3 from 8:45 am. Release is Monday, Sept. 4 at 6pm.
- 14. If for any reason the exhibitor cannot attend after registering, he/she is required to notify the goat superintendent to be eligible for the following year's fair.
- 15. Straight judging in all classes.
- 16. Judging will be Friday, Sept. 1 at 1 pm for Fiber Goats followed by Pet Goats at 2 pm. Judging will be in the Cattle Show Ring.
- 17. Dairy Goat Show will start at 10 am on Monday, Sept. 4 followed by the Market Show. Judging will be in the Cattle Show Ring.
